Your personal data will be processed in order to make contact pursuant to Art. 6 sec. 1(a) and (f) of the General Data Protection Regulation, as the legitimate interest of the Data Controller in order to reply to a message sent via the contact form and/or for marketing purposes, provided that consent is given in this respect.
4. The Recipients of your personal data are exclusively the following:
 - a. authorized employees and associates of the Data Controller;
 - b. entities cooperating with the Data Controller, in particular suppliers of IT systems and IT services as well as service providers supplying the Data Controller with technical, IT and organizational solutions which allow the Data Controller to run their business, including our websites and electronic services provided through them (in particular computer software suppliers to running our services, e-mail and hosting providers as well as software providers for company management and providing technical support to the Data Controller);
 - c. entities authorized to do so on the basis of generally applicable laws.
5. Your personal data will be stored for the period necessary to provide feedback to the message sent via the contact form.
6. You have the right to request the Data Controller to allow you to access personal data, rectify it, delete or limit the processing of the data.
7. You shall have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority.

9. Your personal data will not be transferred outside the EEA.
10. Your personal data will not be processed in an automated way.
